When I first met him he looked nothing like a farmer or "homesteader" (a person who wishes to utilize their lands to sustain their lives), but more like a hipster. He introduced himself as "Rocky"—yes, Rocky—and as I shook his hand warmly images of Sylvester Stallone and Burgess Meredith flew through my mind. We didn't see each other for sometime when we recently crossed paths last Fall.
